### **AAVSB® Offers Veterinary Continuing Education Tracking (VCET)**

**Kansas City, MO (October 15, 2015)** – The American Association of Veterinary State Boards (AAVSB®) offers the Veterinary Continuing Education Tracking (VCET) system to its membership. VCET is available for free to veterinary licensing boards and regulated veterinary professionals. It streamlines the process of tracking continuing education (CE). Veterinarians and veterinary technicians can easily log their CE through a MyAAVSB portal and organize the information into a standardized report. When the licensing board asks for a record of CE, the user can either print the report to mail or, if the board accepts CE by email, the user can send the email to the licensing board directly from the VCET system.

AAVSB President Dr. John Lawrence noted, “The idea of a CE tracking system actually originated from within our membership a few years ago. The Board of Directors immediately saw the incredible value that a system like this would be to our member licensing boards and to the veterinary professionals they regulate, so we made developing VCET a strategic priority. It’s easy, fast, and standardized.”

Any veterinary professional can access VCET through the free MyAAVSB portal at [aavsb.org/login](http://aavsb.org/login). Those without an existing account will be prompted to complete a short application.
